# <u>Directions to Career and Technical Student Organization Culminating Assessment – worth</u> 100 points

Student will be given the opportunity to complete a keynote presentation on their iPad on a career and technical student organization of their choice.

### Part 1: Parts of the lesson

Students will think about the nine career and technical student organizations' we discussed in the unit. Students will create a keynote presentation, explaining in detail, every aspect of the organization of their choice and how they can benefit from being a part of that organization. Students should have:

- (1) One-slide explaining who the organization is and what the organization is about in three complete sentences or more.
- (2) One-slide explaining the mission, values, objective, and goals of the organization.
- (3) One-slide explaining the history of the organization in three complete sentences or more.
- (4) One-slide explaining the different chapters, number of advisor, level of membership, and number of participants the organization has.
- (5) One-slide explaining the organizations membership process (how to join and how to start one at your school) in four sentences or more.
- (6) One-slide explaining any conventions, meetings, programs, and competitions the organization has.

## Part 2: Reflection paper

- (1) Students will also turn in a one-page (double spaced) paper reflecting on how the student can benefit from the organization. The student will need to give FOUR examples of how the student can benefit from joining the organization. Each example given needs have at least TWO sentences or more explaining the benefit in detail.
- (2) Time new romans, size 12 font, and one-inch margins

### Criteria's

There will be eight criteria's for this project and the highest point each student can get for each criteria is four points.

The project must include:

- (1) One-slide explaining who the organization is and what the organization is about in three complete sentences or more.
- (2) One-slide explaining the mission, values, objective, and goals of the organization.
- (3) One-slide explaining the history of the organization in three complete sentences or more.
- (4) One-slide explaining the <u>different chapters</u>, <u>number of advisor</u>, <u>level of membership</u>, <u>and number of participants the organization has.</u>
- (5) One-slide explaining the <u>organizations membership process</u> (how to join and how to start one at your school) in four sentences or more.

- (6) One-slide explaining any <u>conventions</u>, <u>meetings</u>, <u>programs</u>, <u>and competitions the organization has</u>.
- (7) <u>one-page (double spaced) paper</u> reflecting on how the student can benefit from the organization. The student will need to give <u>four examples of how the student can benefit from joining the organization.</u>
- (8) Times New Roman, size 12 font & 1 inch margins

The project must be turned in within the first five-minutes of class. Project will be due on Monday, March 16, 2015.
